VI- Reading Comprehension (14) Marks**Read the following passage carefully, then answer the questions below:**

Most Americans think of mail carriers as drivers of little white jeeps with the steering wheel on the wrong side of the car. While this description holds true for many, some people who deliver the mail do so in a way that is quite different from the jeep and mailbag method. Supai, a village in Arizona, has an unusual system. Since 1869, Supai has relied on mules* for the delivery of its mail.

The village of Supai is located in the Grand Canyon. The steep, rocky land makes it difficult to deliver the mail; it is not friendly to the Jeeps. People travel by foot, horse, or helicopter. Obviously, the cost of using helicopters is expensive. Thus using helicopters or the Jeep and mailbags to get mail to the people is out of the question. So mail is delivered to Supai by muleteers—drivers of postal mule trains.

Muleteers use ropes to tie packed boxes to the sides of mules. These packages include **typical** mail like cards and bills but also supplies such as water, bread, and even computers. Muleteers and their mules provide the citizens of Supai with goods and communication **they** need. In return the demand for these services provides muleteers with an unusual workday.

**mule: an animal whose mother is a horse and whose father is a donkey*
